CHIPPEWA VALLEY ELECTRIC COOPERATIVE BOARD VACANCY FOR FEBRUARY 2016 ELECTION

Chippewa Valley Electric Cooperative (CVEC) members who reside in Districts 2, 4, and 7 have an opportunity to serve on the co-op board of directors by running for a position in the February 2016 co-op election. Three positions will be up for election; current incumbents are Harold Flater, Holcombe, representing District 2, Dennis St. Aubin, Jim Falls, representing District 4, and John Petska, Bloomer, representing District 7.

CVEC is owned by its members and guided by directors elected from the membership. Board directors serve three year terms and represent co-op members at monthly meetings. Candidates must meet the qualifications outlined in the cooperative's bylaws and be full-time residents of the district they represent. Director Qualifications

The main qualifications to serve as a representative on the CVEC Board of Directors are -


1. Be a member and primary resident of the district from which elected.
2. Not be employed by or have a financial interest in a competing enterprise or business selling electric energy or supplies to the cooperative.
3. Not be employed by the cooperative.
4. Be in compliance with the cooperative's nepotism policy.

DUAL FUEL HEATING SYSTEMS TO BE TESTED NOVEMBER 18

As the heating season fast approaches, we are preparing for another Wisconsin winter. This includes a test of our load management system.

If you currently participate in our dual fuel or off-peak heating program, the load management system will be tested on Wednesday, November 18 (Thanksgiving is the following week).

Your electric heating system will be shut off at 5:00 p.m. and will remain off throughout most of the evening. Heating systems will be randomly turned back on beginning at 9:15 p.m. and all systems should be back on by 11:15 p.m.

During the time the electric heat is off, customers will rely on their backup heating system. If you experience any problems with your heating system during this test, please contact your heating contractor. If you experience any problem with our load management receiver (pictured at right), contact Chippewa Valley Electric Cooperative at 715-239-6800 or 1-800-300-6800.

This test is a benefit for you as well as the cooperative. We want to make sure your backup heating system and the load control device work properly before we get into extremely cold weather.
